

What to listen out for

What to count	For example
How many items of information?	Where went, when went, who with, what happened, how was it, describing another person
How fluent ?	Can they speak without stopping and hesitating too much? Does it sound smooth? Can they answer your questions easily?
How many time phrases, tenses and opinions, connectives ?	<p>Time phrases: D'habitude, Normalement, Le weekend dernier, l'année dernier</p> <p>Tenses : <i>Present</i> : J'adore, J'aime, C'est <i>Past</i> : Je suis allé(e), J'ai joué, j'ai vu, on est allé, on a vu ... <i>Future</i> : Je vais aller, Je vais jouer, Je vais regarder, J'irai, je jouerai, je regarderai ...</p> <p>Opinions : chouette, super, sensass, nul, pas mal, affreux</p> <p>Connectives : et, mais, aussi, après, finalement, puis</p>
Did they sound French ?	Are they remembering not to sound the silent letters (eg <i>C'est</i> sounds like <i>say</i> and when they say <i>j'ai regardé</i> are they remembering to sound the <i>ay</i> sound at the end?
Was it accurate ?	Did they miss any words out, did they use tenses correctly
