**What is motivating?**

**Which skills lead to successful language learning?**

- Sentence-building
- Creativity
- Autonomy
- Performance

**How can we teach these skills?**

Pronunciation	Phonics (iconic words – VAK, listening, cognates, prediction, tongue twisters, songs, jokes, comic strips, news headlines)
Memory	VAK strategies Auditory – benefits of singing, fixing key structures and vocabulary, fun/culture, running dictation Visual – colour-coding, visual ‘hooks’, chunking, mind-mapping, visual cues, collective memory Kinaesthetic - pronouns, verbs, vocabulary, TPR, teatro físico, walk the talk, card sort, pictograms, empty your head
Sentence-building	Core language sheets, Haiku, Have I got news for you, questions, talking pictures, maths puzzles, target talk, then and now, say something more, pyramids, tick grid
Creativity	Adapting, generating, communicating, describing, inventing, responding, applying
Performance	Memorising, practising, refining, evaluating, making mistakes, improving, performing
Autonomy	Concentrating, completing, asking, target-setting, evaluating, improving, researching

## Year 7 Example of skills development

Pronunciation	I have learnt the phonics & remember the sounds	I can repeat new words accurately & make links to phonics	I can remember how to pronounce words correctly over time	I can read text accurately that has new language in it
Memory	In class I actively use music, song, gesture & colour to help me memorise	In class & at home I can sort out which words I know and don't know	I can use strategies to memorise single words & sentences	I can use strategies to memorise & give a short talk
Sentence-building	I can adapt model sentences by changing 1 or 2 words to make new meanings	I know how to use different parts of 'tener', 'ser', & 'hay' to build my own sentences	I can use the linking words on the CL sheet to write a short paragraph	I can use all the sentence-building support on the CL sheet to write a short text
Creativity	I can use individual words to create a poem following a model	I can use the language I know to describe a photo	I can adapt the language I know to create a rap/song	I can use the language I've learnt to make an activity for my class
Performance	I can memorise & perform a song in Spanish.	I talk confidently in paired dialogues in class.	I take part 3 times per lesson in whole class interaction (co-teacher)	I take part confidently in role plays in front of the class
Autonomy	I get started straight away on a new task	I can look up new words confidently in a dictionary	I ask questions about language & respond to my targets	I set myself targets & try to meet them

### Meanings that matter: Content and contexts that motivate

- **Age-appropriate** (Simple language can express abstract and/or complex ideas)
- **(Inter-) Cultural** (Comparing and contrasting cultures as a way to deepen understanding)
- **Cross-curriculum** (Making links with other subjects through 'borrowing' or 'collaboration')
- **Music and Song** (Culturally-rich, skills-enhancing, intrinsically interesting)
- **Drama** (Personalises learning, making learning active, favours kinaesthetic preference)
- **Film** (Visual media are culturally-rich, develop listening skills, develop narration skills)
- **Using technology** (making own resources, develop autonomy)
