You have by now also covered numbers, time, family members, classroom objects, and two key irregular verbs 'SER' (to be) and 'TENER' (to have).

As usual, sign up for a free account.



The good thing about **memrise** is that you 'plant the seeds' of knowledge the first time you learn some vocabulary on the site. Then you are sent prompt emails to remind you to 'water your seedlings' or, if you've left it longer, to 'save them from dying'! The idea here is obviously that to retain language in your long-term memory you need to re-visit and re-cycle it little and often.

If you click on the Spanish category from the Top categories list on the left of the homepage, you find a lot of different courses to choose from. These are simply collections of words created by users and are free.

Here is one I found which has numbers (lesson 8), family members (lesson 10) and verb essentials (lessons 1,2, and 3):

This is a site you may want to recommend to your pupils as well. It is free to access and you don't need to create an account.

From the homepage, select **Español** from the menu on the **left-hand side**. You will then see a list of units (Unidades) and a description of what is contained in each. You are now able to complete **Unidades 1-3** and parts of **Unidades 4-5**.

The good thing is that the tasks are short and focused on a small, specific set of language. There are reading and writing tasks. The drawback is that there is no audio to aid pronunciation.



3 YouTube - Focus on VERBS

Now, take a short break and listen to this **verb SER song**. There are several of these online, but some omit part of the verb. This one has the English and the Spanish together, reinforces with the written words, and would be good to use with pupils, too.
